Chester Jenkins is a type designer and publisher, and a partner in the co-operative foundry, Village. Chester received a D.E.C. from Collège Dawson in Montréal in 1992, and has spent the last 15 years working in Montréal, London, Utrecht, Chicago, and New York. He has published several retail typeface families which are used worldwide by all kinds of clients, from CBS Sports to the United Nations. He has created bespoke typefaces for the National Football League, Condé Nast, and the New York Times Sunday Magazine, amongst others. Since 2003, Chester has been developing typefaces in the OpenType format, taking advantage of OT's multi-lingual Unicode support and tremendous stylistic potential. His recent work outside of the Latin alphabet, including Cyrillic, Greek, and Hebrew scripts, will be incorporated in future editions of his published types.
